It is 1922 in a dreary rainsodden England and two women, Lotty and Rose, who both feel trapped by their hum-drum lives and stagnant marriages, meet by chance at their Ladie's Club. Intrigued and tempted by a small ad in *The Times*, they find themselves booking a humble castle in Italy for the month of April. Together with another couple of ladies, the exotic and aloof Lady Caroline Bramble and the severe Mrs

Clayton Graves, who are included to defray expenses, they embark on an adventure in a foreign land that will ultimately change all their lives forever.

This charming play, adapted by Matthew Barber from Elizabeth von Arnim's novel, was first produced in 2003 and has won a number of awards as well as being nominated for a



Tony. It is a delighful, funny and poignant examination of four diametrically opposed women who use their beautiful, enchanting surroundings to re-examine their lives.

**Enchanted April** will mark Trish's fifth production as a director at Seaford and features Lesley Drew, Mandy Crnkovic, Roland Boorman, Roger Trace, Jasmine Chance Ramsay, Tricia Pape, Alan Lade and Margaret Kennedy.

The show opens on Friday 1 September 2023 and runs through to the following Saturday 9 September with matinées only on both Saturday 2 and Saturday 9 September. Evening performances commence at 7.45pm and the matinées will start at 2.30pm.









