The first production of 2024 is the Olivier Award nominated, deliciously dark, satirical comedy **Dinner** by Moira Buffini.

Paige and Lars Jannsen are hosting a dinner party to celebrate the publication of Lars' latest philosophical best-seller, *Beyond Belief*. The guests include a microbiologist, his sexy celebrity-newsreader wife, and a bohemian artist. A

succession of unusual courses, served by an enigmatic waiter found via an obscure website, and interrupted by the arrival of an unexpected guest, a working-class van driver, lead to some surprising and deadly revelations.

This is the chilling dinner from hell, served with lashings of vitriol, dark humour and



acidic bon-mots. It first premiered at the National Theatre in 2002 and Moira Buffini was praised for her energetic, exciting as well as pithy and philosophical writing.

Please note that this hilarious opening production to the year deals with adult themes and contains very strong language.

Directed by Mike Truman, **Dinner** feaures Roland Boorman, Sandy Truman, Jenny Lloyd-Lyons, Jasmine Chance-Ramsay and debut performances at

Seaford for Will Neame, Steve Lambert, and Peter Cornwell.

The show opens on Friday 1 March 2024 and runs through to the following Saturday 9 March with matinées only on both Saturday 2 and Saturday 9 March. Evening performances commence at 7.45pm and the matinées will start at 2.30pm.

Douglas Wragg, last seen in *When We Are Married*, has passed away. Whilst Paula Woolven, last seen as the daughter in *On Golden Pond*, received the British Empire Medal in the New Year's Honours List. She is the founder of Havens Food Cooperative, the food waste prevention and redistribution project in Newhaven (see the article in January's Seaford Scene). Finally our dear friend Wendy Picott suffered a stroke, which will take some time to recover from. We hold her in our thoughts, prayers and hearts.

This last piece of news was so hard to bear after the Picott's great success with *All My Sons*. Like me, a lot of the audiences were completely involved in the play, due to the realistic acting of the whole cast, some new to our stage, and in tears at the end. Even the group of young students! Andrea Hargreaves was so impressed, and wrote an amazing review, but knew it was too late to get in the next Seaford Scene. So she asked if she could read it out on our local radio, bringing in many extra audience members to enjoy the play, Alan's set, and the smooth running of both front and back Stage crews. Hopefully they will be back for the March production of *Dinner*, already in rehearsal.

Now I have to tell you that the report on our roof, that we had done following a series of leaks, ran to six pages and was definitely not good news from a financial point of view. For the almost two years we were in Covid lockdown with consequently no income from plays or membership, we still had expenses to pay. Current funds will go nowhere near covering the final amount. Fundraising is going to be essential, but difficult in these straightened times, so if anyone has any ideas, they will be welcome. We need a secure roof over our heads so we can continue to put on amazing plays. Let's see if we can get it all done by our 80th birthday in November 2025.

Finally I hope to see as many of you as possible at our AGM on Friday March 22nd, which will be followed by a cheese and wine social evening. This will be an opportunity for anyone who hasn't yet paid their subs to do so.





DOUGLAS WRAGG

Sadly we have to report the recent death of Douglas Wragg. He had been unwell for quite some time, but was always eager to keep up with, and support, what was happening in Seaford.

Douglas only made two acting appearances at our Little Theatre, but both were memorable. As the patriarch, Henry Horatio Hobson, in **Hobson's Choice** he commanded the stage whenever he appeared, and as the dipsomaniac photographer, Henry Ormonroyd, in **When We Are Married** he gave a brilliantly observed demonstration of increasing inebriation.

I also had the pleasure of acting alongside him, or seeing him act, with other theatre groups (he was a member of several) and you were always guaranteed a reliable and well-observed performance no matter the size of the part.



Recently the impact of his increasingly failing health was a major annoyance to him, not just because he was unable to audition for roles, but also because he was no longer able to visit, as a member of the audience, the theatres he supported. Especially once he was no longer permitted to drive.

Douglas was another of life's gentle men and he will be greatly missed by all those that knew and acted alongside him.

THEATRE GROUNDS

In addition to all our other problems, many of you will have seen the major damage caused to our boundary fencing by some of the violent storms we have suffered recently. The long wire fence on the east side, despite attempts at remedial repairs, finally gave up the ghost just before the opening of **All My Sons** and collapsed along its full length, while a section of the front wooden fence took a severe battering during the last night of the same play and also



hit the deck. Personally I am beginning to suspect the strength of the performances on stage may have played quite a significant part in the destruction. It surely can't be a coincidence.



Anyway this is something else that has been added in to the increasing list of items which need addressing at our theatre. On the plus side we are very fortunate to have the services and expertise of our very own Simon Fox, who is a professional landscape gardener. He had already given up his time and muscle to take over the maintenance of the grounds around the theatre and, since Christmas, spent considerable effort tidying

up this more recent destruction. So thanks Simon, much appreciated.

PRODUCTIONS FOR THE 2024 SEASON

01 - 09 March DINNER by Moira Buffini directed by Mike Truman	An artist, a scientist and a sexpot are coming to dinner. Paige, hostess extraordinaire, is celebrating the publication of her husband's best seller. The arrival of Mike, marooned in the foggy lane after crashing his van, provides an unexpected addition to the evening's entertainment. A silent waiter, sourced from an obscure website, completes the picture. Primordial soup is first on the menu – let the dinner from hell begin. A wonderful comedy chiller, with blood on the carpet before bedtime! Please be advised that this production contains strong language.
07 - 15 June A CHORUS OF DISAPPROVAL by Alan Ayckbourn directed by Trish Richings	A diffident widower attempts to escape loneliness by joining the local amateur light operatic society. By accident (by not ever saying NO) he advances from a small part to the lead while also enjoying the attentions of all the female cast members. Written in 1984 this was Alan.Ayckbourn's 20th play and one of his most succesful earning three major awards, including the London Evening Standard Award, the Olivier Award, and the Drama Award.
06 - 14 September A DOLL'S HOUSE by Henryk Ibsen directed by David Parton	Henrik Ibsen's 'A Doll's House', premiered in 1879 and the effect it had on a very conservative audience was explosive. Nora is very happily married to Helmer and her life looks rosy now that her husband has been made manager of the local bank. But suddenly her world threatens to collapse around her when threatened with blackmail for an earlier indiscretion and the scales fall from her eyes as she realises women are only very second-class citizens. George Bernard Shaw wrote: 'When Nora slams the front door shut behind her, that sound reverberated throughout the whole world.'
06 - 14 December SEE HOW THEY RUN by Phillip King directed by Phil Armstrong	It's the 1940's and the residents of Merton-cum-Middlewick are preparing themselves for the possibility of a Nazi invasion. Meanwhile, a meddling spinster becomes convinced that her beloved vicar's former actress wife is having an affair and attempts to expose her. Add an escaped German prisoner of war, a handsome actor, the visiting Bishop of Lax, a rotund locum priest and some meddling neighbours and hilarious confusion and mayhem result.
