This intriguing thriller by Robert Thomas is directed by Garry Fowler and promises plenty of twists and suspense, plus the odd bit of light relief, to entertain our audiences this summer.

It features the debuts at Seaford of Edd Ginn and Christyan James, (both members of other theatre groups) alongside regulars Sue Shephard, Angie Wright, Josie Hobbs and Alan Lade. Audience members should be aware that gunshots will be fired during the performance.

It opens on Friday 21 July 2017 and runs through to the following Saturday 29 July, with a matinée on Saturday 22 July. Evening performances commence at 7.45pm and the matinée will start at 2.30pm.
