Thanks to Cicely and Debi who did such sterling work getting us ready for each new item.

Death In High Heels promises to bring our 2013 season to a very happy ending. Everyone loves a whodunit and this one is an unusual variation on the theme. Here again, we are lucky enough to have another director new to us (Angie James), and some new faces in the cast too!

OUR NEXT PRODUCTION - *DEATH IN HIGH HEELS* by Richard Harris

DEATH IN HIGH HEELS was successfully adapted for the stage by Richard Harris (*Outside Edge, Party Piece, Stepping Out*) from the book by Christianna Brand, a prolific British crime writer of the mid 20th century. It is set in the hectic backstage area of Christophe & Cie, a smart London couture house of the 1930's, where tensions among the staff are about to rise to murderous levels. Cue the arrival of the charming Inspector Charlesworth and his trusty sidekick Sergeant Lillian Wyler, whose calm, analytical minds are brought to bear on the case. Richard Harris uses all his playwriting skills in cleverly adapting this book into a funny and mystifying detective thriller for the stage.

Angie James makes her debut at Seaford as director with a strong cast of the familiar and the new. Featuring Ann Mabey, Tricia Pape, Steve Wetherilt, Jenny Humphries, Lee Powney, Kay Wetherilt and the Seaford debuts of Susanne Crosby, Clare Forshaw, Helena Bell and Rob McLaren, this promises to be a hugely entertaining and glamorous production that will be perfect for banishing those winter blues.

The show opens on Friday 8 November 2013 and runs through to the following Saturday 16 November, with evening performances from 7.45pm and a matinee on Saturday 9 November at 2.30pm.
