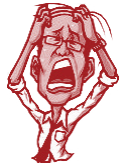

ROGER AND KAREN'S MOUNTING MOUNTAIN CHALLENGE



Me and Karen have set ourselves a challenge to raise money for the *Rays of Sunshine*, a national charity that brightens the lives of seriously ill young people by granting wishes and providing ongoing support in hospital and within the community. This is the current year's chosen charity of the Foresters Friendly Society, to which we belong.

Because fundraising has obviously been limited due to Covid, we were trying to think of different ways of raising money and eventually we decided to climb to the top of Mount Everest! Well, not the actual mountain, but the 29,030 feet equivalent of climbing on walks over the Seven Sisters. My watch tells me how much we have climbed and at present we have reached 8,471 feet. The weather has been kind to us and we are aiming to finish by my big birthday at the end of February.

THEATRE WORKS IN PROGRESS



The additional works have continued apace at the theatre. Following Frank's magnificent brickwork at the rear of the toilet block, the lean-to has been completed with flooring, roof and custom made doors, and the set doors have all been stored inside.

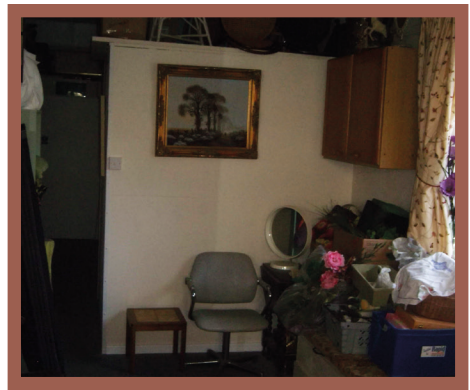
The extension has been completed on the men's dressing room and this has been decorated and fitted out including new laminate flooring which we acquired for nothing.

Two new, sturdier tormentors have been built and fitted either side of the stage, both stage right and stage left passages have been redecorated and the workshop sink has been given a facelift.

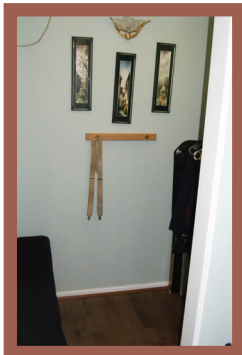
Finally the stage lights have been cleaned and Pat-tested, the props and set furniture have been re-organised and the green room toilets have undergone a bit of a make-over.
