THE VIEW FROM THE CHAIR




HAPPY NEW YEAR TO YOU ALL.

DANIEL CHANDLER RETURNS TO DIRECT the next production for the Little Theatre, the classic *Gaslight* by Patrick Hamilton, a Victorian thriller that has gripped audiences since its first production in 1938. The story revolves around the family of Jack Manningham and his vulnerable and disturbed wife, Bella and the effect on their lives of the appearance of Rough, a former police detective.

The show opens on Friday 23 February and runs through to the following Saturday 3 March, with evening performances from 7.45pm and a matinee on Saturday 24 February at 2.30pm.


