OUR NEXT PRODUCTION - NOT NOW DARLING by Ray Cooney & John Chapman

The next production at Seaford is an unapolegetic return to the non-PC world of the late 1960's.

Not Now Darling comes from the successful and prolific pens of Ray Cooney and John Chapman and is directed by Garry Fowler, who brought us the sell-out **Murder on the Nile** last year.

This huge West End hit is a fast paced, very funny farce set in the elegant Mayfair fur emporium of Bodley, Bodley & Crouch, where Gilbert, one of the trio of owners, is hoping to arrange a discrete assignation with his latest conquest, Janie, while his wife is on holiday. Unfortunately circumstances conspire to ensure that the course

circumstances conspire to ensure that the course of illicit love does not run smoothly and confusion reigns supreme.

Once again we are pleased to have another couple of debuts at Seaford with the introduction of Amanda Alexander in the role of Janie, and Debbie Cox (a behind the scenes stalwart) as Miss Whittington. Alongside them are a number of Seaford regulars: Lee Coleman-Powney, Jenny Humphries, Mary Young, Alan Lade, Dug Godfrey, Trish Richings, Alan Clifford, and Clare Forshaw.

The production opens on Friday 26 July 2019 and runs through to the following Saturday 3 August with matinées only on Saturday 27 July & Saturday 3 August. Evening performances commence at 7.45pm and the matinées will start at 2.30pm.

Please note that this season we are trialling having two matinées (on the first and last Saturdays), with no evening performance on either Saturday.



This is the love story of Ethel and Norman Thayer, who are returning to their summer home on Golden Pond for the forty-eighth year. Norman is a retired professor, nearing 80, with heart palpitations and failing memory - but still tart tongued, observant and eager for life as ever. Ethel is ten years younger than her husband and the perfect foil for Norman. She delights in all the small things that have enriched and continue to enrich their long life together. They are visited by their divorced, middle-aged daughter and her dentist fiancé, who then go off to Europe leaving his teenage son Billy behind with Norman and Ethel for the summer. The boy quickly becomes the 'grandchild' they have always longed for. Norman revels in taking Billy fishing and thrusting good books at him, he also learns some lessons about modern teenage awareness, and slang, in return. This is a truly beautiful play and I am very much looking forward to what lies ahead for me, the production team and cast.

NORMAN THAYER JNR	late 70's - On the one hand he is boyish, humorous and grand, while on the other he can become moody and forgetful.
ETHEL THAYER	10 years Norman's junior - Energetic, and knows how to manage Norman's moods. Wife of Norman.
CHARLIE MARTIN	40's - big, smiley, happy personality. A laugher! The postman.
CHELSEA THAYER WAYNE	40's - daughter of Norman and Ethel. Athletic, tanned, humorous.
BILL RAY	40's - dentist and fiancé of Chelsea and father of Billy. Attractive and well dressed. Good sense of humour.
BILLY RAY	in the play he is a 13/14 teenager, son of Bill, but I am willing to look at 15/16 year old. Flippant, but only to cover his awkwardness. Eager, bright, and with bad posture.
