SIMON WILLIAMS IS PROBABLY BEST KNOWN AS Major Bellamy in *Upstairs Downstairs* but he has also, in recent years, become an accomplished playwright, particularly in the field of comedy. This play, which marks Jack Mortimer's directorial debut at Seaford, is a hilarious comedy revolving around the loves, life and ultimate demise of an aging old-school actor and peer of the realm, played by Alan Baker. Also featuring performances from Trish Pape, Stella Dench, Sylvia Aston, Margaret Kennedy and the debuts, at Seaford, of Molebatsi Molepe and Alan Clifford, this production marks a fitting end to our season this year.

The show opens on Friday 14 November and runs through to the following Saturday 22 November, with evening performances from 7.45pm and a matinee on Saturday 15 November at 2.30pm.


