

THE VIEW FROM THE CHAIR




WELL HERE WE ARE AGAIN nearly at the end of another season. With the rehearsals now started for the final play of 2009, *Make Way For Lucia*, and the well deserved applause for *Men Of The World* fading away, we look forward to the 2010 season. But before we do that, there is one extra date that a great many people are rehearsing for and that is *70 Years On - A Wartime Nostalgia*. Sadly, by the time that you receive this newsletter, September 19 will have passed and gone. For those of you unaware of what this was all about, it was part of the Seaford Live 2009 Festival that the Theatre supports, both by providing free accommodation and providing a show ourselves.

Briefly returning to the John Godber play, sadly this had a dip in our audience numbers. Not seriously, 71% or so, but enough for us to take note of. People sometimes wonder why I bang on about audience numbers, so let me explain a little if I can. Constant low audience numbers affect the Theatre in every way. Loss of seat money, of course, but that can result in low programme sales, that in turn can affect our advertisers. Low seat sales mean less taken at the coffee lounge. It is difficult to attract acting and backstage members to a theatre that has persistent low audience numbers. No actor I have ever met likes playing to small audiences. Ask any local small outfit about their struggle to cast even the most basic of productions and you will see what I mean.

Now we are of course nowhere near what I have described above, and hopefully never will be. But we have to keep a constant weather eye open.

OUR NEXT PRODUCTION - *MAKE WAY FOR LUCIA* by John Van Druten



MANY OF YOU MUST already be aware of the genteel life of Tilling and its best known residents, Mapp & Lucia, from the best-selling novels by E F Benson. This play, directly adapted from those books, brings that world, and the torn village loyalties and conflict that arises between these two forthright women, into brilliant, humorous life.

Directed by Mary Young, with Sylvia Aston and Tricia Pape as the leads and featuring a superb cast of thousands (well, eleven) *Make Way For Lucia* is the perfect end to this year's season of plays and will hopefully leave you amused, delighted and with a warm glow to help ward off the onset of winter.

The show opens on Friday 13 November and runs through to the following Saturday 21 November, with evening performances from 7.45pm and a matinee on Saturday 14 November at 2.30pm.

On a totally different subject, (Alan Lade is always complaining he never has enough to fill this Newsletter with) I am often asked how we choose the plays that we stage. Well, each year's repertory is usually selected at least one year in advance. This is done by a committee of experienced actors and directors, at presently headed by myself, but always subject to change. They come up with a short list of possible candidates for production and submit them to the Management Committee for their approval. Bear in mind that this can be quite a process, scripts have to be read, discussed, staging's considered, certainly numbers involved in the cast and backstage etc., once four productions have been decided on, it then becomes necessary to consult our small group of directors to establish which ones they would prefer to produce. This done, the production committee can then turn its attention to the next season.

On several occasions in the past, we have consulted our audiences as to what they would like to see at The Little Theatre and they have always expressed a liking for good comedy, thrillers, costume drama etc., roughly in that order.

What occurred to me recently was that it might be a good idea, through this column to ask for YOUR idea of a good play or drama. It could be a favourite play of yours, either modern or older. Maybe something that you have seen recently and would like to see performed at Seaford. Bear in mind that we cannot perform work currently being produced on the professional stage, and we are not either equipped or able to do musicals. But we will consider any reasonable request. A favourite author perhaps? We frequently produce plays that we have done some 15/20 years ago, so it could be a play that you would love to see again.


