The "Little" Seaside Revue which came under the SeafordLive! banner in September was enormously enjoyable and we owe debts of gratitude to Graham Tubb (Director and master tapdancer!), Rosemary Kemp (a most inspiring and encouraging piano accompanist), the visiting Wave Tap Ensemble (who lifted everyone's spirits), and all enthusiastic participants. Not forgetting the memorable backdrop of Seaford beach huts expertly painted by Alan Lade. Graham and Rosemary have agreed to do the honours again next year, so that's something to look forward to.

Any of you who have been inside the theatre recently will have seen its newly plastered walls. We have finally bitten the bullet and had major work done to damp-proof the building. Our new decorations were beginning to look sad far too soon after they had been done, and the paint in the auditorium was starting to bubble and flake away. A damp proof course has been injected into the walls and we have ensured that we have enough air bricks to keep up the necessary ventilation at ground level and below. The work comes with a 20 year guarantee so ... money well spent!

Now we look forward to Dennis Picott's production of *Straight And Narrow*, from 9-17 November, which promises to be a sharply-observed and very funny comedy. A good note on which to end the season.

This comes in the shape of his two somewhat dysfunctional sisters, Lois and Nona, and their husbands, and, worst of all, the domineering life force that is Bob's mother, Vera. As far as Vera is concerned, all Bob needs is the love of a good woman. She has no idea that the straight and narrow is not for her only son!

Featuring five talented new faces to Seaford, Trish Richings, Andrea Lowe, Becky Robinson, James Collins and Martin Adams, together with the equally accomplished but more familiar ones of Garry Fowler and Peter Barnes, this very funny comedy will help you to banish away those winter blues.

The show opens on Friday 9 November 2012 and runs through to the following Saturday 17 November, with evening performances from 7.45pm and a matinee on Saturday 10 November at 2.30pm.

ANOTHER SIGN OF THE TIMES



Adapted from the 1953 Ealing comedy film about a group of villagers who, finding that their branch railway line is about to be axed, decide to buy and run the railway themselves in spite of the proposed competitive bus service.

Obviously the smaller parts are only cameos and could be played by others - except Harry and Sgt Wilson - but it would be funnier if they are the same actor! Oh yes, they also all have to sing the *Ferroequinologist* 's *Lament* at the beginning and end of the play as well as involve the audience in the proceedings.

There are 9 scenes in the first Act and 7 in the second - the time is 1952
