
our next production: ALL MY SONS by Arthur Miller

It is four years since the end of the second world war and Joe Keller and his family have a relatively comfortable life in their home in middle America, despite the controversy that surrounded them during the conflict.

Joe and his partner, Steve Deever, ran a machine shop at that time, manufacturing airplane machinery that was vital to the war effort. Deever

was sent to prison after the firm turned out defective parts causing the deaths of several men, while Keller escaped censure and went on to make a lot of money. At the same time Keller's pilot son, Larry, was reported missing in action and has never been seen again.

These two factors still cast a deep shadow over the Keller family, threatening their future happiness. Joe's wife, Kate, cannot come to terms with the loss of her eldest son, while their other son, Chris, is in love with Deever's daughter, Ann, but is struggling to reconcile his feelings with everything that happened during the war.



Add into this mix the return of Deever's son, George, bitter that his father is in prison while Joe has been allowed to walk free, and the scene is set for a powerful drama that is spine tingling in its intensity.

This classic play from the pen of Arthur Miller was based on a true story and received much acclaim on its Broadway debut, despite its open criticism of the ideals of The American Dream. More importantly it established

Miller as a playwright of note.

Directed by Dennis Picott, assisted by Sue Williams, *All My Sons* feaures David Parton, Josie Hobbs, Tim Telford, Peter Barnes, David Hallett, Roger Trace, Jasmine Chance Ramsay, and debut performances at Seaford for Jodie Taylor and Nicky Patching.

The show opens on Friday 1 December 2023 and runs through to the following Saturday 9 December with matinées only on both Saturday 2 and Saturday 9 December. Evening performances commence at 7.45pm and the matinées will start at 2.30pm.

DAVID WILLIAMS



David Williams only joined Seaford Little Theatre in recent years, having fallen under the spell of Sue during a production at Lewes. They married in January 2020 in a marvelous lifeaffirming ceremony that was a privilege to witness, and set up home together in Seaford.

David quickly threw himself into the life of SLT taking on the membership secretary role as well as joining the production committee and, after the restrictions of Covid, was an

instrumental part of the team getting our doors back open again with *Mixed Doubles* in which he both acted and directed.

More recently he returned to one of his great passions, Shakespeare, when he assisted David Parton with dialogue coaching and characterisation for Twelfth Night a production that gave him great joy.

David was a lovely gentle man, with a keen intelligence, dry sense of humour and sharp mind full of curiosity on a wide range of subjects. He brought so much devotion and happiness into Sue's life, and it is an enormous tragedy that their time together was cut so cruelly short. Our love and sympathy goes out to the whole family for their sad loss.

JOHN HAMILTON

John Hamilton only came to performing at the Little Theatre in his later years but quickly established himself as a natural on stage and became one of our most respected actors.

He made his debut in the sinister Kiss of Death in the part of Bernard the criminal psychologist, and was soon a regular member of our repertoire of actors.

On stage John was generous, reliable and captivating and



always inhabitated any character he portrayed completely. He was a master of both comedy and drama and made many memorable appearances including Make Way for Lucia, Men of the World, The Wooden Dish, In Praise of Love and, what many considered his finest performance, Norman Thayer in **On Golden Pond**, leaving Henry Fonda floundering in the shadows.

Off the stage John was a wonderful friend who was a joy to talk to, with a keen intelligence, delightful humour and a wealth of knowledge.

We send all our love and condolences to Marianne and his family at this sad time.

PRODUCTIONS FOR THE 2024 SEASON

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01 - 09 March DINNER by Moira Buffini directed by Mike Truman	An artist, a scientist and a sexpot are coming to dinner. Paige, hostess extraordinaire, is celebrating the publication of her husband's best seller. The arrival of Mike, marooned in the foggy lane after crashing his van, provides an unexpected addition to the evening's entertainment. A silent waiter, sourced from an obscure website, completes the picture. Primordial soup is first on the menu – let the dinner from hell begin. A wonderful comedy chiller, with blood on the carpet before bedtime! Please be advised that this production contains strong language.
07 - 15 June A CHORUS OF DISAPPROVAL by Alan Ayckbourn directed by Trish Richings	A diffident widower attempts to escape loneliness by joining the local amateur light operatic society. By accident (by not ever saying NO) he advances from a small part to the lead while also enjoying the attentions of all the female cast members. Written in 1984 this was Alan. Ayckbourn's 20th play and one of his most succesful earning three major awards, including the London Evening Standard Award, the Olivier Award, and the Drama Award.
06 - 14 September A DOLL'S HOUSE by Henryk Ibsen directed by David Parton	Henrik Ibsen's 'A Doll's House', premiered in 1879 and the effect it had on a very conservative audience was explosive. Nora is very happily married to Helmer and her life looks rosy now that her husband has been made manager of the local bank. But suddenly her world threatens to collapse around her when threatened with blackmail for an earlier indiscretion and the scales fall from her eyes as she realises women are only very second-class citizens. George Bernard Shaw wrote: 'When Nora slams the front door shut behind her, that sound reverberated throughout the whole world.'
06 - 14 December SEE HOW THEY RUN by Phillip King directed by Phil Armstrong	It's the 1940's and the residents of Merton-cum-Middlewick are preparing themselves for the possibility of a Nazi invasion. Meanwhile, a meddling spinster becomes convinced that her beloved vicar's former actress wife is having an affair and attempts to expose her. Add an escaped German prisoner of war, a handsome actor, the visiting Bishop of Lax, a rotund locum priest and some meddling neighbours and hilarious confusion and mayhem result.

The Production Committee meets several times a year, to discuss which plays would make an attractive, varied programme for the following year, aiming to make this decision by August at the latest.


